


The cross and the flag

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People couldn't exist without symbols. These representations of objects and concepts allow us to explore the relationship between things and ideas in a way that is otherwise impossible. The American flag is, of course, a symbol, but the symbol of what? The answers to these questions are at the center of a debate between supporters and opponents of laws prohibiting the burning or desecration of the American flag. A symbol is an object or image that represents something else (object, concept, etc.). Symbols are ordinary, which means that one thing is something else, because people agree to treat it that way. There is nothing in the symbol that requires it to represent a symbolizable thing, and there is nothing inherent in the symbolic thing that requires a particular object to represent it. Some symbols are closely related to what they represent, for example, the cross is a symbol of Christianity because the cross is believed to have been used to perform Jesus. Sometimes the connection between a symbol and what it represents is abstract, such as a ring used to represent marriage, because the circle is thought to represent continuous love. Most of the time, however, the symbol is completely arbitrary without any connection to what it represents. Words are arbitrary symbols for objects, the red flag is an arbitrary symbol of having to stop as well as socialism, and the scepter is an arbitrary symbol of royal power. It is also the norm that things that are symbolized exist before the characters present them, although in some cases we find unique symbols that exist to the point that they symbolize. The pope's signature ring, for example, not only symbolizes his papal power, but also constructively that the government without a ring, he can not authorize decrees. Some believe that there may be mystical connections between symbols and what they symbolize, for example, that you can write something on a piece of paper and burn it to influence what the words were symbolizing. In truth, the destruction of the symbol does not affect what is symbolized, except when the symbol creates what is symbolized. When the pope's ring collapses, the ability to authorize decisions or appeals under the rule of the popes also collapses. Such situations are an exception. If you burn a person in an effigy, you also don't burn the actual person. If you destroy the Christian cross, Christianity itself does not affect. Just because your wedding ring is lost doesn't mean the marriage is broken. So why do people get upset when characters are wrong, treated disrespectfully, or damaged? Because symbols are not just isolated objects; symbols mean something to people who understand and use them. Bowing in front of the symbol, ignoring the symbol, and destroying the symbol all send messages about their attitude, interpretation or belief regarding that symbol as well what he represents. In a sense, such actions are symbols in themselves, because what a person does in relation to a symbol, a symbol, about how they talk about what symbolizes. Also, since symbols are ordinary, the symbols meaning depends on how people treat it. The more people treat a symbol with respect, the more it can represent good things; the more people treat a symbol disrespectfully, the more it can represent negative things or at least stop presenting positive things. This is the essence of the debate between opponents and supporters of bans on the desecration of the American flag. Supporters say the desecration undermines the symbolic significance of the flags; opponents say that desecration occurs only if or because its meaning has already been undermined, and that it can only be restored by the behaviour of those who disagree. Prohibition of flag desecration is an attempt to use the law to enforce the first point of view. Because he avoids the possibility that the second may be true, that this is an illegal use of state power to short-circuit substantive debates about the nature of what the flag symbolizes: America and American power. The whole point of banning flag burning or desecration is to suppress the communication of interpretations and attitudes towards the American flag, which are incompatible with the beliefs and attitudes of most Americans. It's an expression of the minority's view of what the American symbolizes, which is in question here, not the physical protection of the symbol itself. The stripes that are present on the United States flag are representative of the original 13 colonies that existed in the United States. The red stripes represent the hardness and prowess that have been used to get the US where it is. The white stripes represent the innocence and purity that exist in the country. The stars present in the flag also have symbolic significance. They are representative of 50 states that exist in the United States. There have been many different designs and targets for the stars that are on the flag. As states were added and replaced to make them fit properly on the flag. The blue that is present behind the stars represents the vigilance, perseverance and fairness that the U.S. offers its citizens. Since the creation of the first Betsy Ross flag in Philadelphia, the flag has undergone many changes. Although it remained the same color, it had several different designs. There are also many decorations such as gold edging that can be added to the flag to commemorate certain moments or represent certain triumphs. In areas where governing bodies can impose restrictions on flag a lot, the minimum lot size requirements for building a home are often greater than for a kerb home site. For example, you may need a lot of at least 10,000 square feet, or 0.22 acres, except for this flagpole section before you can build, compared to, say, 8,200 square feet (0.18 acres), for the traditional curb lot.
